

SHINING A LIGHT. PROTECTING OUR KIDS.

Our Action Plan

Stillwater Public Schools' policy of allowing students to choose the bathroom facility that aligns with their self-proclaimed gender identity must be changed. Here are some specific action items for policymakers.

1. Oklahoma Legislature and Governor Kevin Stitt

- Oklahoma has enacted a law clarifying that biological males cannot compete against girls in athletics. We need a law stating that biological males have no right to access locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other intimate space reserved for biological females.
- The state could tie school district funding to protecting the rights of girls, and also provide for the legal defense costs if districts are sued by the Biden Administration.

2. Stillwater Board of Education

 The School Board needs to amend its policy to protect biological female students. The district already provides private bathroom facilities that can be used by students who claim a gender that is different from their biological sex. There is no need to permit any biological male to use facilities set aside for girls.

3. Oklahoma Attorney General John O'Connor

- Parents can thank General O'Connor for sending a letter to the U.S. Department of Education arguing against extending Title IX by regulatory fiat to claims about gender identity.
- The Attorney General's office should advise all Oklahoma public school districts of the real purpose of Title IX and that court decisions from other jurisdictions or on other legal provisions are not binding on our schools.
